



## 2026 STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce the availability of the 2026 Richard 'Dik' Days Scholarship application. The Scholarship Committee will use this application in the scholarship selection process.

The Richard 'Dik' Days Scholarship Fund is an initiative formed through collaboration between the Coalition of Black Trade Unionists (CBTU) Connecticut Chapter, the International Union, United Automobile, Aerospace & Agricultural Implement Workers of America (UAW) Region 9A and the Days Family.

The Richard 'Dik' Days Scholarship Fund is created in memory of Richard Adam Days, who was a labor educator for the UAW. Prior to his retirement he was the Education & Civil Rights Director for the UAW, Region 9A. Brother Days was a rigorous trade unionist, political activist and community advocate. As a labor educator, Dik worked endlessly to educate union and non-union workers, their families and young adults on labor history, the contributions of organized labor in the workplace and the rights of workers. He was a member of the UAW for over 40 years, a charter member of the National Coalition of Black Trade Unionists, co-founder and former President of the Connecticut Chapter of the Coalition of Black Trade Unionists, co-founder of the Connecticut Chapter of the A. Phillip Randolph Institute, a lifetime member of the NAACP, a lifetime member of the African American Alliance, and a six term member of the Bloomfield Town Council. Brother Days had an impact on many lives and helped those he touched better understand their role in building a union and the greater good for the communities in which we live.

If you are a Connecticut resident and a graduating high school senior attending college full-time in the fall or a current undergraduate student enrolled full-time in a college/university, you are eligible to apply for one of these scholarships. Qualifying applicants must also meet the minimum requirements noted below. Three \$2,000 scholarships will be awarded in 2026. If you are awarded a scholarship, you will be required to provide your social security number and student ID number for the college/university in which you are enrolled or plan to attend. Scholarship funds will be sent directly to the college/university for use towards your academic financial needs. Recipients must reply to the scholarship committee and provide their student ID and social security number within three days of notification for banking and tax purposes or the award may be forfeited. Winners are expected to participate in the Bloomfield Juneteenth Parade on June 20, 2026 and the RAD Committee Celebration Luncheon afterwards.

You will be notified by June 3, 2026 if you are selected as a scholarship recipient. If you have any questions or concerns please contact Donna Becotte at (860) 214-0726.

\_\_\_\_\_ **DEADLINE May 8, 2026 at 12:00 midnight.** The complete application, including all requested documentation must be received by the Scholarship Committee by the deadline date. Complete applications, including all requested documentation must be received by the Scholarship Committee, including a school transcript and recommendations, all in one email. The deadline date is the latest date and time your application will be accepted by the Scholarship Committee, and incomplete or password protected submissions will not be accepted. NO EXTENSIONS will be granted. Your name should clearly appear on each page of documentation. All documentation should be typed. **Applications will only be accepted via a single email document (including letters of recommendation) to radscholarshipfund2011@gmail.com. We will check for any use of artificial intelligence (AI) in the essays, and if suspected of AI use, your application will be disqualified.**

\_\_\_\_\_ **Brief Biography:** Use a narrative format and include offices held, major accomplishments, other scholarships/awards, volunteer and community services performed, hobbies, etc.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Official School Transcript:** If you are in high school, provide a copy of your official high school transcript. If you are currently enrolled in a college/university and will attend full-time in the fall semester, please provide a copy of your current official college transcript.
