

To President William E. Louis from General Dynamics, Electric Boat, a hand delivered letter and attachments with an administrative change being considered for the pension plan outlined in the letter dated December 1, 2016. Electric Boat is looking at moving pension plan participants from the General Dynamics Retirement Plan (Government) to a new General Dynamics Retirement Plan (Electric Boat). Also with this package is a follow up letter that follows a conversation on December 8, 2016 concerning the potential administrative change to the pension plan outlined in the December 1, 2016 letter.

<u>First Vice President Ken Rowland</u> delivered a letter (194-16) on December 21, 2016 from the MDA-UAW Local 571 to GD Electric Boat Human Resources (S. Alger) requesting information (Security Reports) for Grievances U-0003-16 and U-0004-16.

Officer Reports:

<u>First Vice President Ken Rowland</u> reported no new Step 3 Grievance's. Reported a Step 3 meeting on Grievance U-0017-16, salary doing bargaining unit work (testing IPDE program software). Councillor Jeff Carver and Grievance Rep Bill Stamp provided helpful testimony about job responsibilities during testing of software. Progress was made but no resolution to the grievance as of this writing; another meeting will be scheduled.

Second Vice President David M. Reagan reported no new Step 3 Grievances.

Recording Secretary Patricia A. Clay reported no new Step 3 Grievances.

Financial Secretary William May reported a new Step 3 Grievance. Grievance U-0001-17 was filed with the company for a termination without just cause. Grievance U-0018-16 was settled, non-bargaining unit personnel performing bargaining unit work, resulting in 16 hours pay. Filed Grievance U-0006-16, met with the company for failing to equalize OT, Dept. 460, Test Writers. Grievance denied. Setting up meeting with the company for Step 4.

Sedgwick will ask a few general type questions, name, address, SS number, about illness, supv phone, physicians name/address, etc.). Sedgwick administrates / manages short term disability claims on behalf of General Dynamics.
